



## **B.Sc. Nursing Gets Full Accreditation ...Intake now Increases to 100**

The Nursing and Midwifery Council of Nigeria (NMCN) has granted full accreditation of the Bachelor of Nursing Sciences program of Bayero University. The accreditation followed satisfaction of the requirements by the Council and is for five years, with effect from June 2019.

Accordingly, the admission intake of the Nursing Science program had been increased to 100 students

per session as against the hitherto 50 candidates. The Senate, however, noted and appreciated the full accreditation status and commended the stakeholders for their commitment.

Meanwhile, the Senate at its meeting ratified the administrative approval given for the M.Sc. Agricultural Technology.

## **Senate Expels 63 Students, Rusticates 13 Others for Examinations Misconduct**

The Senate of Bayero University, Kano has expelled 63 students for their involvement in various forms of examination misconduct. In the same vein, 13 others were rusticated for one year, according to a statement signed by the Director, Examinations, Admissions and Records (DEAR), Amina Umar Abdullahi.

According to the statement, this action followed a recommendation earlier submitted by the Senate Committee on Examinations Misconduct and Leakages approved on Wednesday, 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2019 and taken at the 374 meeting of the highest decision making body of the institution.

The expelled students included 10 from the School of Postgraduate Studies, 10 from the School of Continuing Education and 7 each from the Faculties of Basic Medical Sciences and Computer Science. However, the Faculties of Education and Management Sciences have 6 each and Engineering, FEES and Physical Sciences 4th and 3, respectively. The Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies has 2 expelled students and Faculties of Communication, Allied Health Sciences and Life Sciences have the least number of affected candidates with only one student each.

“The following candidates were expelled for being involved in examinations misconduct in accordance with Category 20:17(Ai, iii, iv, v, vi, vii x, xii) General Examinations and Academic Regulations (GEAR) and 3.4.2(Ai - xi) General Regulations Governing Postgraduate Studies (GRGPS) as the case may be,” said the statement.

The Senate had also rusticated 13 other candidates for one year or two semesters for their involvement in examination misconduct in accordance with Category 20:17(Bi - Bv) General Examinations and Academic Regulations (GEAR) and 3.4.2(Ai - xi) General Regulations Governing Postgraduate Studies (GRGPS), as the case may be.

It equally directed that 19 other students be served with written warning letters. The candidates' actions contravened category 20:17 (Ci-v). It instructed that their examinations scripts should be processed accordingly. However, four students were exonerated from any offence as no case was established against them. Their respective Departments were directed to release their results. They are to be graded incomplete in courses indicated against their names.

Upon consideration of the Submission, Senate approved as follows:

## Professor Ajiya Appointed President/CEO of NCC's Digital Bridge Institute

Professor Muhammad Ajiya of Bayero University's Centre for Information Technology (CIT), has been appointed as the President/Chief Executive Officer of Digital Bridge Institute (DBI), a subsidiary of the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC).

The appointment which was conveyed penultimate week will take effect from October, 2019, for an initial four-year tenure renewable thereafter. He was appointed on merit following his vast knowledge on Information Technology, particularly in optical communication engineering.

The DBI was set up in the wake of the global growth of the Telecommunications (Telecoms) and Information Communications Technology (ICT) sectors, which was especially well noted in Nigeria.

Following the grant of Digital Mobile Licensing by Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC), the subsequent emergence of mobile services in the country, increased number of operators, as well as significant expansion of private capital investment, the government noticed the urgent need to get trained and suitably qualified human resources in the telecommunication industry, hence the establishment of DBI as a solution.

Acknowledging the need to continue to foster the rapid

development and growth of the Nigerian Telecommunication marketplace, as well as the potentially significant vulnerability which lack of human resources could pose, the Nigerian Communications Commissions (NCC) established

DBI in May, 2004 and subsequently established zonal offices in Kano, Abuja, Lagos, Yola, Asaba and Enugu.

The DBI, which is an International Centre for Information Technology and Telecommunications Studies, also aims to pursue initiatives such as indigenous software development, research with

particular focus on cybercrime & security and electronic multimedia advancement, using the instrument of ICT, among others.

Professor Muhammad Ajjiya was born in Misau town of Bauchi State. He graduated from Bayero University, Kano, in 1994 with B. Engineering (Electrical) and obtained his M. Eng in the year, 2000, where he proceeded to University Putra in Malaysia in which he obtained his PhD with specialization in Optical Communication Engineering in 2010.

He joined the services of Bayero University in 2004 as Lecturer II and rose to become a Professor in 2016. He

was also a onetime Head of Department of Electrical Engineering and held many ad hoc responsibilities within and outside the University. Prior to that, he worked in Bauchi state as an Assistant Technical Officer (ATO) with the Bauchi State Development Board in 1984. In 1997 he was posted to Arewa Ceremics Ltd, Misau as Technical Officer. In the year 2000, he was appointed General Manager/CEO of the same Arewa Ceramics Limited. In 2002, he was appointed by Bauchi State as the pioneer Managing Director/CEO of Bauchi Plastics Limited until 2004, when he left the company to join the services of this University.
