BUK Gets Human Resource Health Learning Hub

Bayero University's Centre for Gender Studies (CGS) in collaboration with Women 4 Health has established a multi-million-naira training hub for women health workers as part of the effort to address the growing shortage of women health personnel in rural areas.

The Learning Hub, which is situated at the Centre for Gender Studies, is a DFID funded programme to serve as a special training centre for health personnel at the primary and secondary levels of our health institutions to cater for the rural and semi urban towns.

Speaking at the launching of the programme at the Moot Court Room in the Faculty of Law, on Thursday, 30th January, 2020, the Sarkin Kano, Malam Muhammad Sunusi II, commended the foresight of the Management of Bayero University for the initiative, saying that other Universities ought to emulate this laudable programme.

Sarkin Kano, who was represented by the *Jarman Kano*, Professor Isa Hashim, said that Universities were primarily established to undertake three mandates, which are teaching, research and community service. According to him, it was the responsibility of the University to look inward and provide solutions to the numerous problems facing the society.

According to him, the issue of poor health system, especially in the rural areas, has been a great source of

concern and, therefore, requires a collective effort to address it, most particularly as it affects the issue of women and child health.

He charged that many of the health workers would not want to work in rural communities, a situation which has worsened health care delivery in the areas, thereby increasing maternal mortality.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, reaffirmed the commitment of the University towards collaboration with relevant stakeholders in finding solutions to the numerous problems facing the society.

Professor Tanko explained that BUK as a leading institution was very much concerned with the socio-economic development of the nation and that was why it had always been ready and willing to join hands with development partners.

In her welcome speech, the Director of the Centre for Gender Studies, Professor Hassana Sani Darma, said the Centre had been in collaboration with the Women For Health Organization since 2018, with the aim of increasing the presence of health personnel at the rural areas.

Professor Darma disclosed that the Centre focused on knowledge creation, analysis of societal norms and exploring strategies of empowering disadvantaged people, explaining that the creation of the Human Resource for Health Hub Learning was one of the approaches initiated by the Centre in addressing some societal problems. Already, she said the Learning Hub had been provided with computers, internet facilities, books and other facilities that would make the programme a huge success.

Also speaking, the National Programme Manager of Women for Health, Dr. Fatima L. Adamu, said the programme which had funding from the Department for International Development (DFID) was operating in some states across North West and North Eastern regions, which comprised Kano, Katsina, Jigawa, Zamfara, Yobe and Borno states.

Dr. Fatima said Bayero University was deliberately

chosen to host the learning centre in view of the commitment of the University towards addressing the societal problems affecting the region as well as the provision of an enabling environment. It said the Centre would coordinate the activities in all the beneficiary states.

According to her, the programme aims at empowering young females who take careers in the health sector such as nursing, midwifery and other subsidiaries in health related fields, and would be posted to rural areas after the completion of their programmes, with a view to boosting health care delivery in rural areas.

Giving further details, Dr. Ladi said it was regrettable that Kano State with a population of over 13million people had only about 2000 nurses and midwifery, which was far in shortage of the WHO standard. Under the WHO specification, Kano ought to have 22,000 nurses and midwifery personnel.

Also speaking at the Lecture session, Dr. Ibrahim Nashabaru identified the signs of Lassa Fever to include gradual onset of fever, body weakness, headache, sore throat and bleeding from orifices, among others. Giving some take-home messages at the occasion, Dr. Nashabaru called on people to observe the hand hygiene mode earlier mentioned and identify Lassa fever patients as early as possible.

In his remarks at the event, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, represented by the DVC Academic, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, declared that the most important thing at the moment was to know how to prevent the disease, since the viral epidemic had just started in the state.

Professor Tanko equally challenged the Infectious Diseases Research Centre to contribute to the world literature on Lassa Fever and offered that the University would give support in that direction.

Representing the Vice Chancellor, the Director Public Affairs, Malam Ahmad Shehu, assured the visitors that their request would be forwarded to the Vice Chancellor. He added that the effort made by the

Public Enlightenment/Advisory on Lassa Fever



- Lassa Fever is an acute viral haemorrhagic fever (VHF) caused by the lassa virus. The natural reservoir for the virus is multimammate rat. Other rodents have also been identified to carry the virus.
- Lassa Fever occurs throughout the year but more cases are recorded during the dry season i.e. November through May.
- Lassa Fever is spread through:
 - Direct contact with urine, faeces, saliva or blood of infected rats.
 - Contact with objects, household items and surfaces or eating food, contaminated with urine, faeces, saliva or blood of infected rats.
 - Person to Person transmission by contact with blood, urine, faeces, vomitus, semen, vaginal secretions, breast milk or other body fluids of an infected person.
- Sign and Symptoms of Lassa Fever:

Lassa Fever presents initially like any other febrile illness such as malaria but accompanied with unexplainable bleeding from ears, eyes, nose, mouth and other body openings.

The time between an infection and appearance of symptoms of the disease is 2 to 21 days. Early treatment and diagnosis increase the chances of survival.
- People most at risk are:
 - People of all age groups who come in contact with the urine, faeces, saliva or blood of rats.
 - People living in rat-infested environments, which increases their chances of coming in contact with rats.
 - People who consume potentially contaminated food stuff especially those left open over-night or dried outside in the open.
 - People who handle or process rodents for consumption.
 - People who do not observe hand hygiene when appropriate.
 - Relatives who take care of sick person with Lassa Fever at home.
- How to prevent yourself from Lassa Fever
 - Maintain personal hygiene by, among others, frequent hand washing with soap and water or use of hand sanitizers.
 - Store food in containers with lids and discard any food remnants.
 - Keep your home and surrounding clean and tidy to discourage rats and other rodents from entering.
 - Ensure proper sanitation by, among others, proper waste disposal.
 - Cook all food thoroughly.
 - Wash fruits thoroughly, vegetables and other food items before consumption.
