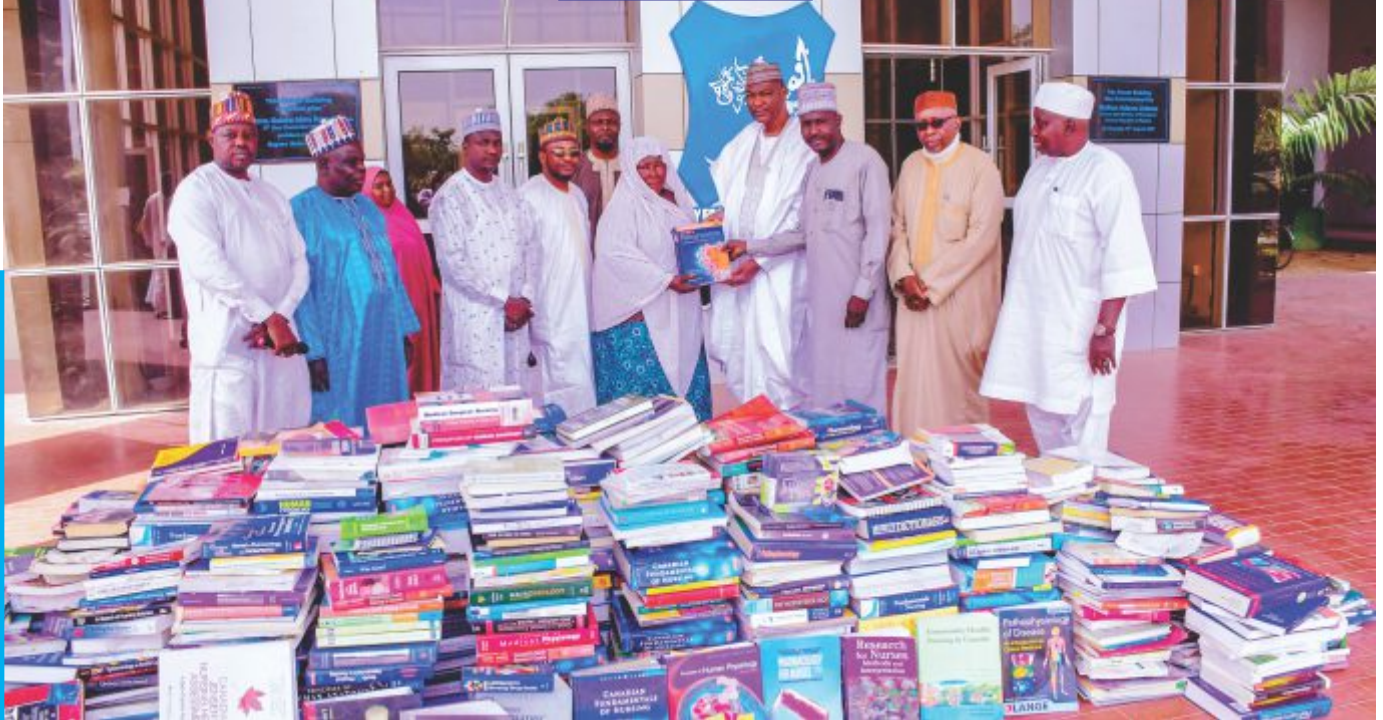




## Philanthropist Donates Books worth 15 Million to Bayero University

research Nurse, (E-MOTIVE Trial Kano). On IVON Trial Research Project, Adabiyya Shehu Tijjani emerged the best IVON Trial research Nurse at Nuhu Bamalli Hospital. (Best IVON Research Nurse Kano).

During the occasion, a Physiotherapist, Aliyu Garba Sudawa took time to lecture the audience on how to use physical exercises to relieve stress. He advice extensively on the need for mild exercises such as stretching, normal walking, brisk walking, jogging to rigorous exercises.

Also the Centre's Deputy Director Research, Professor Taiwo Amole delivered lecture on time management. ## Student Affairs Division Adopts e-voting for SUG Election

The Student Affairs Division, Bayero University is set to apply e-voting for the forth coming election of the University's Student Union Government. It could be recalled that the deanery had developed a secured software name BUK-E voting that undergone a series of integrity test that may help the process of conducting free, fair and credible election.

Speaking on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2023 the Dean of the Students Affairs, Professor Shamsuddeen Umar said the era of election malpractice in whatever capacity had become history as far as Bayero University is concerned. Because according to him, the election is purely electronically. He said students from any location will cast their votes as student will just log in his registration number and get screening password through OPT message that will lead him directly to vote for the candidate of his choice after undergoing a series of processes in the website.

Professor Umar said the software can conduct a multiple election at the same time and the candidates too can only obtained their nomination form for contesting through the software as no candidate can be nominated manually. It is our hope that it would be accepted by majority as “no matter how credible election is, the looser may always

complain, but what we are aiming at is to create a strong electoral body that comprises all Presidents that represents

every faculty in the university and to be monitored by experts and Students Affairs Division”.

Earlier Comrade Umar Katibu a student from the Department of Quantity Survey, Faculty of Earth and Environmental Studies (FEES) explained the E-voting processes which gave clear picture of how credible the election will be if the procedures are followed.

# Faculty of Dentistry holds Retreat to Herald 2023

Faculty of Dentistry has organized a one day retreat on Thursday 12th January, 2023 at ACEPHAP Conference hall in Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital, with the theme "Leadership and Conflict Management."

The Provost College of Health Sciences, Prof. Aisha Kuliya Gwarzo who was represented by Dr. Bashir Kaka commended the Faculty and the management for its initiative in organizing the retreat which she described as one of the best of its kind.

Professor Kuliya-Gwarzo said the retreat was a welcome development, adding that participants especially the younger generation will learn the aspect of leadership to enable them excel. She promised the college continuous supports and assistance whenever the need arises and wish them a successful deliberation.

Prof. Borodo in his presentation titled "Leadership and Conflict Resolution Skills as Panacea for Faculty Development" defined leadership as a process of influencing the activities of an organized group towards goal achievement and doing jobs through other people.

He said leadership skills are not automatic and require development and practice, adding that a leader must be a critical thinker, innovative and creative, trustworthy, with conflict management skills and emotional intelligence.

According to him, clashes of personality, open interest was natural in any working group, however, a leader needs skills, strategy and tactics to address such disagreement effectively, swiftly and skillfully for group harmony.

Professor Borodo said conflict can be resolved through candid discussion on issues, active listening with open mind and empathy, determine root cause of escalation, negotiate, compromise and also distinguish between intention and interpretation.

Another presenter, Dr. Saidu Ahmad Dukawa, Head of Department, Public Administration in his paper titled "Leadership and Conflict Management" defined conflict as the presence of interest or value of different individual or groups are incompatible and frustrate each other's attempt to achieve objectives.

He said a leader should recognize which conflict management strategy is most appropriate for each situation because it's not "one-size - fit all".

He said to effectively resolve conflict, it require certain

competence on the part of the leader, such as monitoring team relationships, effective communication, coaching individuals, dealing with issues before they escalate as well as using participative approach.

The third presenter, Mallam Habu Sale Gumel, deputy director special duty also spoke on the theme of discussion Leadership and Conflict Management. He said conflicts are unavoidable in organizations. It's a normal by-product of people trying to work together and since people differ amongst themselves, It is not expected they agree all the time.

"The leader's target should therefore always be to limit the number of conflicts, minimize the scale of each conflict, prevent it from harming Individuals or the organization and make the conflict yield benefits," he affirmed.

Earlier, the Chief Medical Director, Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital Prof Abdulrahman Sheshe who was represented by Mallam Habu Sale Gumel, in his remarks emphasized the impact of the retreat on the younger generation, saying they had so much to learn especially on the theme of discussion. He said the hospital would be losing most of its senior doctors to the inevitable call of nature aging, which comes with retirement. Thus, making the responsibility shift to the younger generation.

The Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry, Professor Tunde Bamgbose and the faculty officer Haj. Rakiya Abdu Inusa both gave vote of thanks at the end of a successful retreat, followed with a group picture of all participants.

- e. Date of assumption of duty
