



BUK Management Visits Security Chiefs in Kano, Commends Pro-activeness in Addressing Challenges

The Management of Bayero University, Kano has commended the security agencies in Kano State for the adequate security cover rendered to the university and environment during the End Bad Governance national protest.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who led the Management team on courtesy visits to the heads of Security Agencies in the state on Wednesday, 14th August, 2024, expressed profound appreciation for the proactive measures taken by deploying their personnel to the university throughout the protest period. Those visited include the Commander, Three Brigade, Nigerian Army, Bukavu Barracks, the Kano state Police Commissioner and the Director State Service.

At the Three Brigade, Nigerian Army, Bukavu Barracks, the Vice Chancellor told the Commander that “the Management decided to pay a special visit to your good office so as to register our profound appreciation for the special consideration given to the university. In particular, your officers and men have done wonderfully well in securing the university during the last national protest. We are indeed very grateful for this.”

According to him, the university campuses have been the target of attacks by hoodlums, but for the deployment of troops the University remained peaceful to which the soldiers on ground thwarted the bad intention, thereby making the campus more comfortable and calm throughout the tensed situation.

In particular, Professor Sagir Abbas said the Commandant of Janguza Barracks has been very cooperative with the Management as he

always responds to our request for security cover. “We remain grateful.”

He assured that the doors of the university are always open to partner with the Army in the area of training and research. According to him, should they need any special training or short course, the command should not hesitate to indicate their interest and the university will oblige.

Earlier responding, the Brigade Commander, Brigadier General M. A. Sadiq, thanked the management for the visit and assured that the Command would always be happy to support and assist the university in any way possible. He noted that “Bayero University is very dear to us, and we shall do everything humanly possible to protect it.”

General Sadiq, who expressed sadness as to the way in which Soldiers are often invited to quench civil unrest in

the country, however, charged members of the academics to conduct a thorough research to find a solution to that. "You need to educate the citizens about our primary assignment," he declared.

Also the team had visited the Kano State Police Command to express similar appreciation, explaining that the Police in the state have been very supportive to the cause of the University. The Vice Chancellor, particularly, commended the Rijiyar Zaki and Dorayi Police Division for what he described as its adequate security surveillance within the University environment.

The Vice Chancellor, while congratulating the new Police boss, prayed for a hitch free assignment in Kano. He also said the visit was to further solidify the existing relationship between the University and the Police Command.

The Police Commissioner, Salmanu Dogo Garba, who received the Vice Chancellor and his team, expressed delight for the visit, saying that Police is a friend to all and said that it is their civic responsibilities to ensure peaceful environment in the society.

The Management team was also at the State Command of the Directorate of State Service in which the Vice

Chancellor, Professor Sagir Abbas expressed gratitude for the existing cordiality and the tremendous assistance the personnel of the Service have been rendering with a view to ensuring a peaceful atmosphere within the University community.

In his response, the Director, Alhaji Alhassan N. Muhammad, reaffirmed the commitment of the Service in protecting and securing the state from any element of criminality. In particular, he said University as a cosmopolitan place which brings together diverse people has to be given special attention and consideration. "This is part of our national service, we shall always be there for you, feel free to always come to us."

NCRRD Organizes Two-Day Capacity Building on Teaching Early Grade Reading

The Nigeria Centre for Reading Research and Development (NCRRD), Bayero University, Kano through the support of the office of the Senior Special Assistant to the President on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) organized a Two-Day Capacity Development Training on Teaching Early Grade Reading to neighboring community primary Schools.

The two-day training took place on Tuesday 13th and Wednesday 14th August, 2024 at Center's Conference Room, New Campus. It was aimed at equipping teachers and ensuring that all children develop strong foundational reading skills as a proviso for a brighter future.

In her opening remarks, the Director of the Centre, Professor Talatu Musa, welcomed participants to the

training. She disclosed that the Center was established through a collaboration between Bayero University, Kano and Florida State University to promote the culture of reading especially at early grade level.

According to her, the collaboration was made such that BUK provided the manpower from its lecturers who specialized in the teaching of languages and teacher education, adding that these lecturers were trained by Florida State University to acquire the best methodology in the teaching of early grade reading, which was popularly known as 5+2 components of teaching reading (phonological/phonemics awareness, phonics, oral reading fluency, vocabulary, comprehension plus concept of print and writing).

She disclosed that the training came into being as the contribution of the Centre toward a successful take-off of the newly introduced National Reading Framework policy. She added that it took the Centre about five months to plan the free programme with 100 participants that were sourced from public and private community primary schools including Zamfara, Katsina, Jigawa and Kano States.

The Director said in addition to the train-the-trainer programme for Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) conducted in May 2024, where two representatives each from the 36 states of the federation were trained, in preparation for the early-grade reading policy.

She hoped that the free training would provide the participants the required proficiency in the teaching of reading that would also revive the reading culture among the students at all levels of education.

Earlier, the Deputy Director, Research of the Centre, Prof. M. A. Kamba gave an overview of the workshop and ground rules to guide the participants through the workshop.

Prof. Amina Adamu, who is the Deputy Director (Admin. and Partnership) made her presentation on **“Enhancing Teaching Early Grade Reading through Phonemic Awareness.”** She opined that 'phonemic awareness' as the ability of a child to understand the written symbols (letters and alphabets) and the ability to distinguish and manipulate phonemes in a spoken word. She cited examples as if a child can segment individual sounds in the word *dog*, count and say those sounds individually and or if a child can listen to the sounds /f/ /a/ /s/ /t/ and blend them to say the word *fast* was also showing the evidence of phonemic awareness.

Dr. Aminu Bala Danyaro, made his presentation on **“Fluency Activities for Improving Teaching Early Grade Reading Skills.”** He began by lamenting the deteriorating nature of Nigeria students' competence and performance in reading, adding that a number of researches depict that reading had not been taught in systematic or implicit ways, especially in the elementary level of education in Nigeria, which he viewed as a serious challenge that need to be addressed. He described 'reading fluency' as complex and multifaceted that is made up of at least three key elements; accuracy, rate and prosody which he explained in parts.

In his paper titled; **“Vocabulary Development for Early-Grade Reading,”** Prof. Mansur Sale Kiyawa stated that

'vocabulary' is as a tool and which is as old as human oral communication known to the human species. He, however, said the concept of the term was equally versatile and described in different ways by different linguists. He explained four (4) types of vocabularies often considered by linguistics to include, *listening, speaking, reading and writing.* He went further to discuss on stages, strategies and content for vocabulary development to the participants in relation to the Early-Grade Reading. He related difficulty in communication at the basic levels of education to lack of vocabulary.

Dr. Umar Kabir, who presented a paper on **“Systematic and Explicit Phonics Instruction for Early Graders,”** explained to the participants the qualities of good phonics instruction, phonics key terms, sequence of systematic and explicit phonics lesson, phonics skills methods and strategies with practical sessions, among other things.

Other facilitators who made presentations at the Day-2 of the workshop were Prof. M. A. Kamba, who spoke on **“Engaging Libraries to implore Early-Grade Reading Skills,”** Dr. Aisha Umar Abdullahi Tsiga, presented her paper on **“Techniques for Teaching Comprehension in Early-Grade Reading,”** Dr. Bello S. Abdullahi, spoke on **“Teaching Effective Writing Skills at Early-Grade,”** Malam Abdullahi S. Ahmad, took the participants through **“ICT and technology integration for Teaching Early-Grade Reading,”** and Dr. Adamu Idris, made his presentation on **“Components of Reading at Early-Grade.”**

The training was attended by a representative of the office of the Senior Special Assistant to the President on Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), Mr. Lobina Chineke Nkem, a well-trained Florida research fellow and many others within and outside the State.

CDA Trains Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security Staff on Urban and Peri-Urban Agriculture

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Bayero University Kano (BUK) conducted a training workshop for the staff of the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security (FMAFS) on *Urban and Peri-Urban Agriculture*. The workshop, held from July 9 to July 13, 2024, aimed at providing theoretical and practical knowledge to employees of the Nutrition and Food Safety Department of the Ministry.

The training featured numerous presentations and hands-on sessions facilitated by Dr Mustapha Mohammed Bello.

Participants engaged in practical sessions at the various units of the CDA Research and Training Farm, including the greenhouses, livestock and poultry facilities, and water and irrigation management. Participants were trained in media preparation for vegetable establishment, nursery and greenhouse management, and best practices in handling seedlings. The practical sessions also covered

drip irrigation installation and maintenance, and water quality assessment.

The workshop also included a practical session on poultry, livestock, and fish production units, where participants learned about the equipment and technologies used in fish farming, including machinery for processing and value-addition.

Participants shared positive feedback on the hands-on training, noting its potential to promote safe home farming and inform policy-making in agriculture and food nutrition practices. Mr. Adunlawo Julius Adekunle, leading the participants from FMAFS, remarked, "The World Bank-sponsored training aims to build capacity and enlighten beneficiaries in Gombe State, our area of intervention." He praised the CDA, BUK, for its excellence in urban and

peri-urban agriculture training.

Mr. Abare Amos commented, "The practical sessions have been thorough, and my understanding of fish hatchery and livestock production management has greatly expanded." Another participant expressed appreciation for the sophisticated agricultural technology experienced during the training and commended CDA for their exemplary research and training facilities.

The workshop concluded with participants committing to applying the knowledge gained to their work, ensuring improved urban and peri-urban agricultural practices and enabling policies.
