The Numerical Optimization Research Group is one of the top international research group domicile in the Department of Mathematical Science, Bayero University Kano with 45 memberships across most higher institutions within and outside Nigeria. The group visited Bayero University Kano on Tuesday, 7th January, 2025.

The Research group led by Prof. Muhammad Yusuf Waziri, said they were at the office of the Vice-Chancellor to pay him a visit and update him on the activities, achievements, contributions of the research group as well as to inform him of the forthcoming international conference holding in the University.

Prof. Waziri disclosed that the research group had a partnership with international co-researchers and contributed in publishing a total of 599 publications, 6,561 *Scopus Citations index*, 9,779 *Google Scholar Citations index* since 2017. He added that out of the 599 publications, 103 were quartile ranked including; Q1:31,

Q2:42, and Q3:30 journals. The group also contributed 457 *impact factor* and 85 *H-index journals* based on individuals.

He stated that the part of the achievements recorded by the research group included; winning of two (2) international research grants in University Utara, Malaysia (UUM) and collaborated with sister universities of Putra Malaysia (UPM), Thailand and India, among others. And also collaborated with Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) in sponsoring students to pursue their education out of which six (6) students graduated with PhDs and one (1) M.Sc. student.

He said the group was created purposely for researches and mentoring, adding that recently *Science Direct* had published 500 best mathematical of Africa out of which seven (7) featured in the publications were members of this group.

He also highlighted some of the group's activities including; Bimonthly degree and monthly non-degree research presentations, free research talks and receiving research students for background courses from sister universities, among others.

Prof. Waziri, disclosed that the group were planning for hosting an international conference in Bayero University, Kano with proposed 200 participants of both national and international researchers.

Responding the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas, thanked the research group for the visit and appreciated what they had been going silently. "I believe part of the position of the University in ranking was as result of this achievements," he stated.

SERVICOM Directorate Collaborates with School of Continuing Education to Address Key Challenges

overcoming persistent issues, and strengthen collaboration aimed at enhancing the quality of education and administrative processes.

The Director Directorate of SERVICOM Professor Aliyu Muazu, expressed his heartfelt appreciation to the management and staff of the School of Continuing Education for accommodating the meeting on such short notice. He commended the university's significant investment in elevating the school to its current stature, emphasizing the importance of maintaining and building upon these achievements.

While addressing the lecturers, he urged them to demonstrate greater punctuality, dedication, and commitment in their roles, highlighting their pivotal role in sustaining the school's excellence.

The Director reassured everyone that the SERVICOM Directorate is committed to supporting, not victimizing, individuals, and called for their collective cooperation to

ensure a more effective and harmonious service delivery framework.

He advised the research group to continue with the good efforts and be publicizing their work for encouragement from part of staff and the University. He assured them that his door was wide-opened to support researchers for the betterment of the University. The VC announced the donation of one million naira to further boost the effort of the research team.

In his vote-of-thanks, Malam Ya'u Balarabe Musa, thanked the Vice-Chancellor for giving them time to voice out their achievements to the University Management. He appreciated the kind support and encouragement giving to the research group which he said it would motivate them to double their efforts in producing more researches for the progress of the University.

The Director highlighted several concerning reports received by the SERVICOM Directorate regarding practices within the School of Continuing Education. "We received a lot of complaints these included instances of continuous assessment (CA) tests being conducted on examination days, delays in invigilation and marking, and significant gaps in the timely production of transcripts".

He emphasized that such issues have adversely affected the institution's reputation, with BUK graduates missing crucial opportunities both locally and internationally due to transcript delays. The Director explained that this is an open administration, they should feel free to report whatever challenges they are facing and the VC chancellor has promised to assist in every capacity.

In his response the Dean School of continuing Education Professor Usman Dau Aliyu, who was represented by the Deputy Dean Dr. Balarabe Abubakar welcomed SERVICOM BUK to SCE, explained his delight "this visitation has become an eye opener for me and I believe to all the staff in SCE, thus the issue of SCE has been peculiar over time due to the nature of students we are dealing with but we are grateful for having this avenue that we will channel our complaints to the management directly."

He further more stated some of the challenges they were facing in SCE that comprises of less or Zero Supply of power, office furniture and roof leakages, late reception of information and Poor Water system among others. But the biggest challenge they are having is result compilation which is due to non-inclusion of SCE in BOOK REST. "Despite all effort by the Dean of SCE to be included in BOOK REST which will ease in result compilation all effort had been in vein, but we indulge the management support to look into the matter" He added.

Among the SCE team that attended were Hajiya Atine Maryam Ali Administrative Secretary, Dr. Kabiru Ibrahim HOD Social Science and Administration and Danladi Musa HOD Science among others.

He explained that the ACT competition serves as a qualifying ground for the global ENACTUS competition, which will be held in Thailand later this year. Yusuf promised that by September, the team would return to present the global trophy to the university.

In his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, commended the team for their outstanding performance and demonstrated further support by adding N250,000 to their winnings.

CDA Launches Student Training and Employability Program

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), in collaboration with its Regional Agribusiness Innovation Hub (RAIHub), launched the Student Training and Employability Program (STEP) on Monday, January 6, 2024. The training is a five-day event which will end on Friday, January 10, 2025.

Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, the Director of CDA, said the programme is part of the deliberate policy to create

students from faculties of agriculture and related disciplines. He emphasized that the program goes beyond technical skills, incorporating leadership and entrepreneurship training.

He also mentioned that a prior research study was conducted to understand industry needs. The findings revealed that many employers were dissatisfied with the employability of graduates, citing a significant gap in the quality of candidates.

According to him employers will be invited to share their expectations regarding employment. Dr. Aminu noted that these interactions aim to provide trainees with opportunities for internships or employment. He urged participants to fully engage with the training, emphasizing that a first degree alone is insufficient in today's competitive job market; requisite skills are essential for success.

Alhaji Sulaiman Ilu Dambazau, a philanthropist and industry leader, spoke on the role of youth employment in agriculture and national development in Nigeria. He described agriculture as not only the backbone of Nigeria's economy but also a vital avenue for addressing youth unemployment.

Dambazau outlined several challenges in youth agricultural employment, including access to land and resources, educational gaps, skills mismatches, market access issues, and negative perceptions. He proposed strategies to tackle these challenges, such as land accessibility initiatives, innovative agricultural education, strengthened market linkages, promotion of agricultural entrepreneurship, and efforts to shift public perceptions.

He concluded by encouraging participants, stating, "Your innovative ideas, energy, and resilience are instrumental in transforming our agricultural landscape and driving national development."

The Director explained that the training aims to equip graduates and graduating students of agriculture with essential skills to enhance their employability. "We initiated this program because many graduates from our institutions struggle to secure jobs," he said. "It's not due to a lack of agricultural knowledge or theoretical background but because they lack fundamental soft skills necessary to apply their training in the industry."

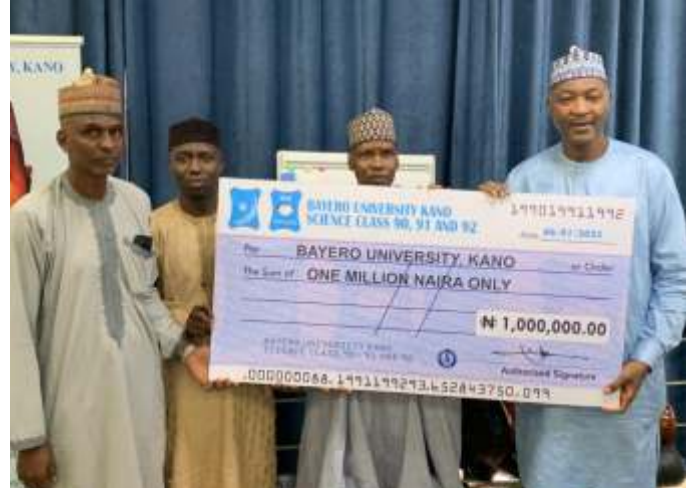

BUK Ready to Partner with CL4STEM Project ...Says Prof. Abbas

The Bayero University, Kano is ready to partner with the Connected Learning for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (CL4STEM) the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has said.

The Vice-Chancellor, who was represented by the University Librarian, Dr. Kabiru Dahiru Abbas, was

speaking at the CL4STEM project scaling and curriculum mainstreaming meeting held on Thursday, 2nd January, 2025 at the Faculty of Education Board Room.

Prof. Abbas stated that the programme was timely and apt in addressing multiple problems including; phobia and

misconception about Mathematics and other science-based subjects, overcome the shortage of students in sciences and other related subjects in the University.

In his paper presentation with the theme: *"Mainstreaming CL4STEM into Pre-Service Science and Mathematics Teacher Education programme in Faculty of Education, Bayero University, Kano,"* Prof. Garba Shu'aibu, who is the team lead and Kano State Coordinator on the CL4STEM project explained that the workshop was to present a proposed CL4STEM curriculum content and to discuss the adoption and mainstreaming of the content into the Pre/in-service teachers training program of the faculty and in particular Department of Science and Technology Education (STE).

He stated that CL4STEM project was a piloted at scale in 2021-2023 in Nigeria, Bhutan and Tanzania. He said the project was funded by International Development and Research Council (IDRC), Canada under the Global Partnership for Education and Innovation Exchange (GPE/KIX).

He noted part of the objective the programme was to scale up the project by *institutionalizing the model CL4STEM Teacher Professional Development (TPD) into pre-service and in-service science and mathematics teacher education training programme.*

He further explained on the key dimensions of CL4STEM knowledge framework for the pre-service training and in-service teacher capacity building including *Specific subject matter Knowledge (SMK)*, *pedagogical content knowledge (PCK)* and *pedagogical knowledge (GPK)* using CL4STEM curated OER modules which he explained in part. He supported his argument using three (3) topics each from Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

The erudite scholar went on in dissecting on the mode of delivery, implementation, training and certification of the project; including use of online/offline OER modules and mobile phone messenger applications, among other things.

Earlier speaking, the Dean of Education, Dr. Abubakar Ibrahim Hassan, stated that the one-day workshop aimed at building the capacity of teacher-educators on way out and how to improve their strategies and approaches in teaching science and Mathematics education.

He disclosed that the programme was a Global Partners for Education (GPE) in collaboration with four (4) universities including; Niger, Kaduna, Oyo and Bayero University, Kano. He encouraged participants to extend the modern approaches learned to their classrooms and by extension to other courses at the Faculty of Education.

The event featured comment, observation, question and answer sessions and reading of the resolutions of the meeting.

This is to inform the general public that online sale of the Bayero University, Kano, Postgraduate Application Forms for the 2024/2025 Academic Session has commenced on Monday 30th December, 2024.

All interested Applicants should visit the Bayero University website: www.mybuk2.buk.edu.ng/cpsforms2024 for details about available programmes and the procedure of applying online. Please note the following information:

1. The cost of each application is twelve thousand Naira (N12,000) only.
2. The duration of the sale and submission of Application Forms is from Monday 30th December, 2024 until 30th May, 2025.
3. An Applicant should ensure that he/she has the entry requirements for the programme applied for, plus five 'O' Level Credits including English Language and Mathematics as appropriate.
4. Applicants for Ph.D/M.Phil and Academic Masters' programmes should ensure that transcripts of their academic records are sent to the Secretary, School of Postgraduate Studies, Bayero University, Kano. Note that Applicants for Ph.D programmes are to provide a short research proposal of not more than 350 words in the space provided on the online application form. The proposal should include title, statement of the problem and objectives.

The Application Procedure

STEP 1 Visit www.mybuk2.buk.edu.ng/cpsforms2024 and under the PROSPECTIVE STUDENT TAB click Applications at the home page. Login using FULL NAME OF THE APPLICANT and select "Applying for a Postgraduate Programme". A username and password will be generated for you. Please take careful note of them, as you need them for subsequent steps of the application process.

STEP 2 Login to your account and generate/print your BUK Personalised Payment Form (BUKPPF). A non-refundable application fee of N12,000 (twelve thousand Naira Only) is reflected on applicant's BUKPPF, to be paid using *Remita e-Payments* and *e-Collection* platform (www.remita.net). Applicants must make sure that they entered ALL the information of the BUKPPF EXACTLY. Applicants must also ensure that all of the following are captured exactly as they are written on the BUKPPF:

STEP 4 Transcript Request Form shall also be filled by candidates for Ph.D, M.Phil and Academic Masters' Programmes in addition to the forms listed in Step 3 above. The applicant prints and processes this at the relevant institution.

STEP 5 Review your forms to ensure accuracy of all information provided. Click 'SUBMIT' to complete the application process.

STEP 6 An Acknowledgement Slip will be generated for you immediately. Print the Slip and keep it safe. The slip will be needed during the collection of admission letter, screening and during registration.

NB: Successful applicants are to note that upon admission they will be required to submit their NYSC discharge certificates, certificate of exemption or exclusion, among other documents during the screening exercise.
